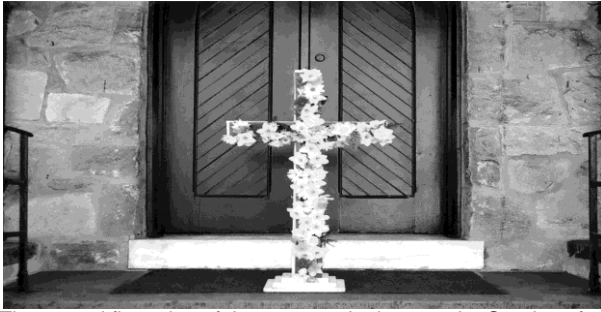

Evangelism...Sharing your Story

Many Episcopalians cringe when they hear the word 'evangelism', thinking immediately of folks standing on a soapbox preaching the Good Word and attempting to drag folks into the church. We want none of it because we don't want to be on the receiving end of such an experience. But that is not Evangelism. Evangelism is just telling your story, to family, friends and neighbors. Every one of us has a story of how we got to St. John's and why we stay. We have a story to tell of the parish and the way folks are made to feel welcome and invited to the table. Now is a good time to remember your story. Many of our Roman brothers and sisters are not happy with the Catholic Church due to the closing of beloved parishes. Some of them may be thinking of leaving the church. Some of those may never darken the door of any church unless they are invited by someone willing to share his or her story. I am not one for 'sheep stealing', but I would rather do that than have unhappy folks never attend church again. We are often a good match for our unhappy Catholic friends because our liturgy and theology are so similar. And so I invite you as members of St. John's to share your story with those you know who are unhappy and looking for another place to worship. Invite them to join you for worship on a Saturday or Sunday. Let's not let them get lost in the midst of their grief over losing their parish. And if we see new faces in the congregation, we all need to extend a friendly hand and encourage the newcomers to become involved in the life of our parish. We have much to offer here in Chews Landing to the wider community.

Retreats, Vacation, and Enrichment

Your rector will be out for a couple of weeks in the coming month. I will be off on retreat with the Anamchara Fellowship on May 16 and will return on May 19 but will continue to be on vacation until May 24. Retreats are important to me in providing a place to recharge my batteries, rest, and spend intentional time with God. I highly commend them to all of you. If you are interested in taking a retreat but do not know exactly how or where to accomplish this, give me a call and I will help you. A suggestion has even been made for a parish retreat experience in the coming year. I think this would be a marvelous idea. Let me know what you think.

Vacations are also a good idea for everyone. We all need time to get away from our job, no matter how much we love it, and just have fun for a time. I hope each of you will have a time away from your work to enjoy life.

Another source of enrichment for me is Continuing Education. The parish is generous in providing time and money for me to engage in Continuing Education. Last fall I took the opportunity to participate in the Diocesan Clergy Retreat where we learned much about the Emergent Church. I hope to participate again this fall. In addition, this year I will be attending a seminar at my seminary in Austin, Texas the first week of June. I will not only learn more about preaching, but I will have a chance to visit with faculty and classmates who will also be attending. This will be a fun and enriching time for me and I am grateful the parish and diocese understand the importance of continuing education.

Pastoral Care

For the past year I have had the joy of getting to know our home bound parishioners as I take communion out to them. I do my best to see them at least once a month, but sometimes even that is difficult. These wonderful folk enjoy knowing they continue to be a part of the parish, even though they can no longer be among us as we worship. We now send out the bulletins to them weekly so they can feel more a part of the community. It would be wonderful if we could manage at least one other

visit a month to these folks, but I need help for that. So if any of you are interested in taking communion out one Sunday afternoon a month to several of our shut-ins please contact me and I will get you trained, licensed, and off sharing a wonderful ministry with me and with those whom you visit.

Coffee Hour

Coffee Hour is the perfect venue welcoming our visitors and newcomers as well as getting to know each other better. Coffee Hour follows the late service and it is an important opportunity to meet and greet people. Keep this a success and join us for some refreshments and good fellowship. Also please consider finding a buddy and hosting a Coffee Hour. A signup sheet is posted in the Parish Hall.

Foyer Groups

Foyer groups are an opportunity for small groups in the parish to meet once a month at each other's homes to share a simple meal and conversation. There is no agenda other than getting to know each other on an informal level. Many parishes have found this a great way to get to know the "old timers" better and introduce the "newcomers" to the parish and the parish history. The groups typically meet for 6 months and then are reformed into new groups for the next 6 months so you are continually meeting and sharing with different folks. Other than the first dinner, when a designated person is to be the host, the rest of the dinners are scheduled by the group as the site rotates throughout the members. The meals are intended to be simple, not a case of seeing how fancy the next one can be. They

can be pot luck or not, depending on the host for the month. There are usually no more than 6-8 people in the group so that most folks can host the dinner in their home, although I have been in parishes where the Foyer group has met in the parish hall due to space issues. If you would be interested in this sort of social gathering please let the Rector know, and I will begin forming groups. July and January would be ideal months to start each Foyer rotation, so let me know soon.

Summer Adult Education

I know that folks are out and about during the summer, but some folks who are "stuck" in town might enjoy getting together on Sunday evenings for a book study. Beginning June 15 at 6PM I invite any who are interested to join me in the second book of The New Church's Teaching Series, "Opening the Bible". We used volume one of this series "The Anglican Vision" as our study during Lent. This volume leads us through the familiar yet sometimes intimidating territory of the Bible. Roger Ferlo, the author, offers ways of reading the Bible today that are grounded in the ways Anglicans have read Scripture from the time of Tyndale and Cranmer. My thought is that after we have read this book we would take one of the shorter books of the Bible and read it together, using what we have learned. Depending on the size of the group we will meet at the parish hall or the rectory for about an hour. Those attending are invited to either eat before or bring something to eat with them. Drinks and cookies will be available. Let the Rector know if you are interested and if you would like for her to order the book for you. Remember if you order it yourself online to be sure and use "Goodshop" so a portion of your purchase is given to the parish.

Goodsearch and Goodshop

For those who use the internet for searching for information or ordering merchandise, please remember to use www.goodsearch.com for your searches and www.goodshop.com for your shopping. I have set my homepage on Comcast to be Goodsearch so I always remember to use it. If you have not tried this, when you go to the site you will be asked who you are "searching" or "shopping" for. Please enter "St. Johns Episcopal Church Chews Landing" so we get the credit. I think if all you enter is St. Johns Chews Landing it still comes up to us. If all you enter is St. Johns you will get a list to choose from. Scroll down to Chews Landing. We are the only Chews Landing in the group. I also encourage you to share this with your family and friends. Let them know it costs them nothing and every time someone searches for information (using Yahoo) we get a penny. When you shop by first going to Goodshop and then link to one of several sites in which to shop (including Amazon) we get a percentage of the purchase price at no cost to the shopper. In the first two months we managed to accumulate \$20 and it is brand new. Just think what we can do if we get family and friends to help out, especially at gift giving times. It is easy, fast, and a way to raise a few dollars, or more, for the parish. Give it a try and if you have any questions just talk to the Rector. You can also go to these sites using the link on our website, www.stjohns1789.org. And if you have not checked out our website, do so today!

50/10/50 Program Trinity Church is the —second church|| for our diocesan community of 161 churches with more than 50,000 members in central and southern New Jersey. As an architectural treasure and hard-to-replicate gathering place for diocesan functions, it is also a center for ministry in the

midst of a resurgent urban area. During the Diocesan Convention, Dean René John introduced the Cathedral's —50/10/50 Program. The first —50 represents the number of congregations that will agree to appoint an ambassador for the Cathedral. The ambassadors will then recruit —10 members from their congregation who become members of Friends to the Cathedral. To be a member, individuals donate at least \$50 (the second —50) to the Friends of Cathedral Fund annually. All donations are tax deductible and are used for building maintenance, providing services and forums on health and other issues to the Trenton community, expanding the youth choir ministry into the neighborhood, and enriching ministry to the community and this diocese.

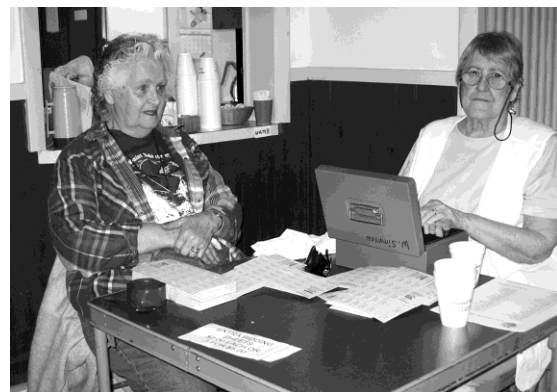
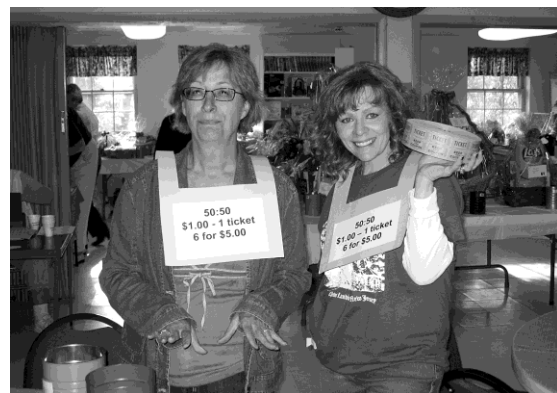
St. John's is now registered with GoodSearch and Goodshop, the new search engine and online marketplace shopping tool with a social mission.

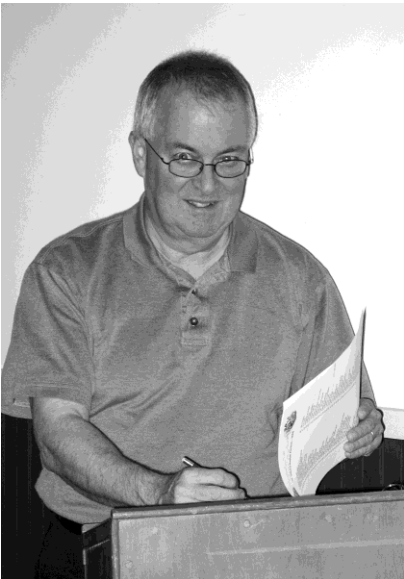

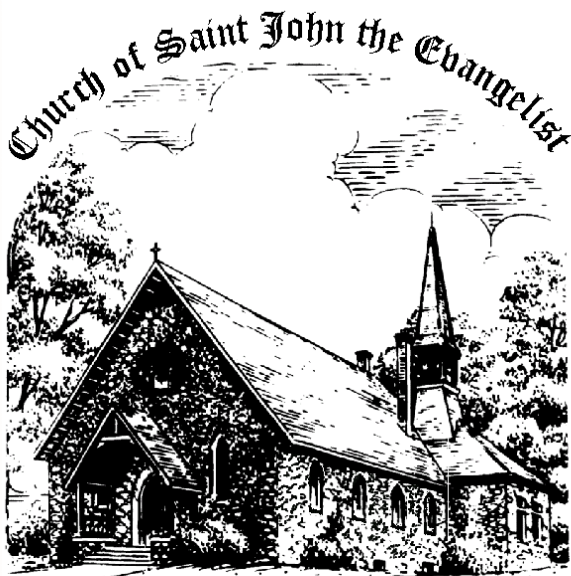
