From the Rector's Desk

As I write this we are deep into Lent, the season in which we have an opportunity to become so much more intentional in our relationship to God and to each other. The two go hand in hand. To be in relationship with God, a significant relationship with God means we also need to be in relationship to all of God's creation, including those people with whom we differ the most. I am spending much more time during this season in prayer, which is always a good thing. In addition to the daily Morning Prayer I am also engaging in Evening Prayer as well as Noonday Prayer and Compline whenever I can fit them in. For these I am using the Celtic book of daily offices from the Northumbria Community in Scotland. The prayers and the readings are all much grounded in God's creation and our relationship with both God and creation. In this season in which God's creation changes from day to day this has been a wonderful Lenten discipline. I realize each day what a blessing it is to work in this community of St. John the Evangelist, where I can hear the Angelus bells calling me to prayer at noon and at 6 PM each day as I work in my office. I pray that each of you is being blessed this year with a Holy Lent in which your relationship to God grows ever deeper.

I also realize that before the next newsletter we will enter into the Easter season, a wonderful season in its own right. Once again the Alleluias will ring out and our Easter Joy will spill out into the world. I find the services of Holy Week intensify my experience of that Easter Joy. I fell in love with the services of Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Great Easter Vigil back when I joined the Episcopal Church in 1974. In fact I was confirmed in our church during the Great Vigil, an experience I will never forget. Each of the services is important. Alone each one tells a part of the story of the Passion of our Lord. But if you arrange to be a part of all three you will find that the sum of them is much greater than the individual pieces. From the foot washing and stripping of the altar on Maundy Thursday through the veneration of the cross on Good Friday and on to the end of the Great Vigil when we sing the familiar Easter Hymn the power of the resurrection of our Lord grows and grows until at the last we are so full that our Joy from Easter cannot help but spill out into the world.

There is plenty of time to check your schedules and make sure you don't miss any part of this season in which we discover how much we are truly loved by God. I will be there to enter into this most Holy of Mysteries. Will you join me?

EASTER EGGS - LEGENDS & LORE:

Thanks to Arline Sidle who found this article.

Ancient Egyptians believed their god Ptah emerged from an egg laid by the almighty Chaos Goose, creator of the sun and moon.

German and Slav peasants rubbed a mixture of eggs, bread and flour on their plows hoping to improve the harvest.

To ensure a big family, a 17th-century French bride would crack an egg on her new home's doorstep before entering.

In the 19th century, builders in Bombay, India, put an egg and milk into the foundations of new structures to protect them from harm.

Even before Christian times, people colored, blessed or exchanged eggs as part of the rites of spring to welcome the sun's awakening from its long winter sleep. Early Christians adopted the egg, which represented the renewal of life, as a symbol of Christ's resurrection from the grave.

Several folktales explain the origin of dyeing Easter eggs. One legend from Poland recounts how the Virgin Mary herself painted boiled eggs in bright colors to please the infant Jesus.

People around the world celebrate Easter or new beginnings with eggs. Eastern Europeans may exchange eggs bearing the letters "XB" for "Christ in Risen". Russians exchange a decorated egg and three kisses. Chinese people present a red hard-boiled egg with congratulations when a child is born. And German immigrants to the U.S. introduced the tradition of the Easter bunny delivering colored eggs to children.

Daytime Episcopal Church Women

Your ECW meets in the parish hall the first Monday of each month – starting time 10:00 a.m. All female members of St. John's church are automatically members and are welcome at all meetings.

So far this year the ECW has had a busy season beginning with the UTO program in October followed by a mini bazaar and flea market in November. A "penny" jar has been placed in the church to collect funds for the Church Periodical Club which purchases books for children both here and abroad. The fund also makes material available to churches, seminaries and schools.

A new program called Threads of Love has been initiated. The group meets the second and fourth Mondays of each month to work on crafts, to learn new talents and for fellowship. Members are presently working on blankets for the Linus Project which provides blankets for preemies, infants, toddlers, children and teens. Our annual soup sale was held on January 19th and was a huge success. We thank everyone who helped make it so – soup donors, soup purchasers and workers. The cooperation we received from our parish family resulted in receipts of close to \$900.00. Again, you have our grateful thanks.

On Shrove Tuesday we held a pancake supper. Thank you to all those who participated, we cleared about \$300.00. A special thank you goes out to Dot Simpson who managed the whole affair from planning to purchasing everything needed and doing the actual cooking.

In February we hosted the ECW of Camden County

District. Mary Wonderlin showed pictures and talked about her recent trip to Africa.

We remind everyone that SCUCS is still a part of our Outreach Program and we continue to collect non-perishable food items for this project.

Two important birthdays were celebrated. Alberta Wilk turned ninety in September and Anna Gibson in October. The cakes were delicious. Congratulations to both ladies.

We look forward to other exciting programs. In March we again will be making Irish Potatoes to sell. Also our popular Basket Auction will be held at the end of April.

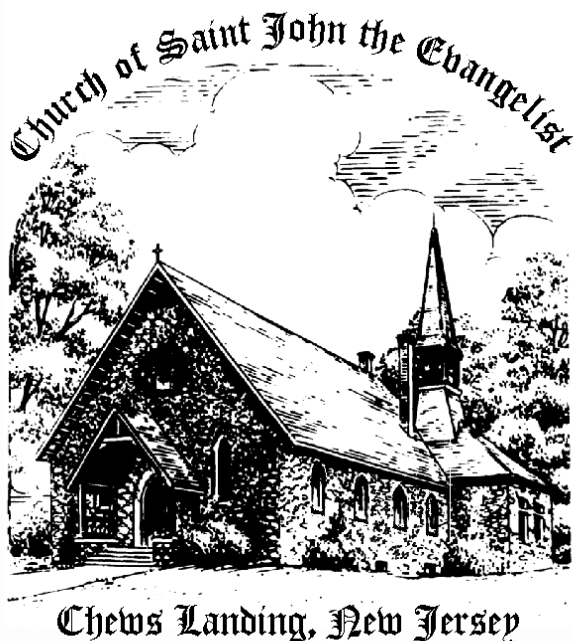
