

SCUCS

Periodically Joyce Root stops in the church and parish hall and gathers up all the donated food to take to SCUCS, a Camden County Senior Citizen organization that provides food for the seniors in our community who are hungry and unable to purchase basic groceries. Hunger is with us no matter what time of year it may be. We often forget this when the weather warms up. Lately there has not been much for Joyce to take in. I encourage all of us to remember SCUCS when we stop in the grocery store. You will find bags available in the parish hall with suggested items listed on an attached card. Take a bag, pick up as much or as little as fits your budget and return the bag to the church. There are many folks who will appreciate your generosity when they sit down to a meal.

Yoga

Is it time to start moving? Getting the muscles to stretch a bit? And do it in a gentle, user-friendly environment? Come give Chair Yoga a chance. We meet on Sunday evenings at 7PM for an hour of gentle yoga to soothing music. Lead by our own Dot Blindenbacher, a certified Yoga instructor, we move at our own pace, never pushing ourselves too hard. If the movement causes pain, Dot lets us know another way to achieve the stretch but not have the pain. We begin and end with quietly sitting in a dimly lighted room and go home feeling refreshed. From the Rector's Desk

While reading over last year's message at this time of year I was struck by two items. One is that The Bible Challenge is almost over. Several of you have been much more faithful than I have at reading the lessons each day. In my excuse I will say that I am reading lessons each day, but the ones that are on the Daily Office Lectionary. It seems I never have time to sit down and read the rest. So for those who have completed the entire Bible Challenge, my hat is off to you. I would love for some of you to say something during this Advent, if you are willing, about what the experience was like for you. The other item of note is that it was a year ago that we first received our blue bracelets with TGIF, Today God Is First. Many of you continue to wear your bracelet. Some have asked for replacements or and additional one to give to others. We have plenty, so if you would like one please ask. You will definitely receive. What has YOUR experience been like while wearing this bracelet? I am happy to say I am much better at wearing the bracelet than reading the scriptures. I love having it on and periodically touching it, reminding me who is, or should be, first in my life.

Advent is a Holy time of year, as I have mentioned in the past. It is a time, created by the church, for quietly waiting and being with God. It is a time for patience and stillness. And yet our society tells us just the opposite. Songs, movies, and even books tell us this is the time of year for hustle and bustle. This is a time with way more things on our "to do" list than hours in the day. But the church is counter-cultural. The church is a place to enter and become something other than what society expects. We just read a book for the BBC, "Ordinary People as Monks and Mystics" and had a quiet day. In both of those experiences we heard about the need for patience, the importance of solitude, the joy of silence, the desire for a new way of living that actually makes sense and leads us into a closer relationship with Christ. On December 14 we are going to try again to host a quiet day. We will continue to talk about the discipline of developing a closer relationship to Christ. We will have an opportunity to look at different methods of praying, of living out our days in contact with Christ, and of developing a Rule of Life that just might be life changing. This may sound like hard work, or something that is too "spiritual" for the ordinary person in the pew, or perhaps even a little scary. That is not the intention. This time is a gentle one in which we can check out ways that just might work in our busy lives to spend time with the One who loves us the most; our Lord and Savior, and choose something that actually works for us. I cannot urge you enough to give this a try. Mark your calendar now and keep that day free so you can come, take a deep breath, and see how your relationship with God might change

for the better. I don't think you will regret this, and you just might hunger for more of these days.
