Advent/Christmas/Epiphany 2018

The End and the Beginning

As the calendar year moves through Autumn, the liturgical year moves toward the End Time. We celebrate the Kingship of Christ and hear readings that describe the Apocalypse. At the same time, after kids return to school, church activities begin to ramp up. That certainly is true of St. John the Evangelist Church.

Saturday, November 17 is celebrated as Founder's Day. We sponsored a 5K run as well as a walk for anyone who wanted to celebrate with us in a physical activity. There was a Spaghetti Supper that evening for everyone (runners, walkers and anyone else who wants to come). Music during the supper will be provided by a parishioner, Cindy Smith, who specializes in popular music of the Colonial period.

On Sunday, November 18, the 10:00 Service followed the 1789 Book of Common Prayer Communion Service.

Christmas Ornament Exchange

November 25 is the Feast of the Kingship of Christ, which is the last Sunday of the Church Year. On that day, we will have a Christmas

Ornament exchange. Parishioners are invited to bring a Christmas tree ornament with the names of family members written on it, or with a tag attached with family member names. The <u>wrapped</u> (it need not be fancy wrapping) ornament is left in a box at the back of the church as you arrive for Service that weekend (all Services) and as you leave, you take one home to pray for the people whose name(s) are on it through the four weeks of Advent.

Advent Book Study

A study of the book, 'What We Talk About When We Talk About

God', by Rob Bell will begin at 7:00 p.m. on Thursday evening, November 29, in the classroom in the lower level of the parish hall building and will continue each of the three Thursdays following. Everyone (parishioner or not) is invited. The book is easily obtained through Amazon.com.



Advent



The first Sunday of Advent is December 2. There will be a blessing of the Advent Wreath at all the Services. Rehearsal for the Christmas Pageant

will follow the 10:00 Service. The Three Kings will begin their journey to the Stable. Let's see if the kids can spot

them as they travel each week! Each Sunday (and Saturday) the Service will begin with the lighting of the Advent Wreath. There will not be Adult Christian Education after Services in December.





On Sunday, December 23, following the 10:00 Service, we will do the "Greening of the Church." Everyone is invited to help. The final rehearsal for the Christmas Pageant will follow a dinner at 5:00 P.M.

The Christmas Eve Children's Service with the Pageant is at 4:30 pm. There will also be Christmas Eve Services at 7:30 pm and 11:30pm.


Christmas Day Service is at 10:00 am.

Dear People of St. John's,

Each year the Episcopal Church joins with a number of other Christian churches in celebrating the birth, ministry, passion and resurrection of Jesus through the use of the Liturgical Calendar and the Revised Common Lectionary. The lectionary is the book from which the readings at all of the services are taken. It has three cycles of readings, simply called Year A, Year B and Year C. The main distinction between the three cycles is the use of a specific Gospel. Year A features the Gospel of Matthew. Year B features the Gospel of Mark. Year C features the Gospel of Luke. Parts of the Gospel of John are included in each of the three years, especially in Year B, because Mark's Gospel is so short. The structure of each year follows the calendar. Beginning with the start of the Church year on the First Sunday of Advent (which occurs this year on December 30), the Gospel tells the story of what led up to the birth of Jesus, which is celebrated at Christmas.

In addition to the difference in the parts of the story covered in Gospel readings, the church distinguishes the different liturgical seasons through the use of colors. The Catholic Church uses Violet for the Advent season, and some Episcopal churches follow that designation. More recently, blue, especially a shade called "Sarum Blue" is used for Advent. An ancient style of Christian worship in England called the Use of Sarum, also known as the Sarum Rite or Use of Salisbury, is a variant of the Roman Rite widely used for the ordering of Christian public worship, including the Mass and the Divine Office. It was established by Saint Osmund, Bishop of Salisbury, and Richard Poore in the 11th century and was originally the local form used in the Cathedral and Diocese of Salisbury, England. It later became prevalent throughout southern England and came to be used throughout most of England, Wales, Ireland, and (later) Scotland. It was this style of worship (which was originally a variation of Roman Catholic worship in Latin), that became the foundation for Anglican worship in the earliest Church of England Book of Common Prayer. Blue was used at the Cathedral of Salisbury for Advent. Until modern times, a wide variety of colors was used for liturgy throughout the year, including yellow. The current Episcopal Book of Common Prayer nowhere dictates what colors are to be used. But custom has brought us to blue to distinguish Advent from Lent, when violet is more commonly used.

The story of Advent is certainly different from the story of Lent. By "story" I am referring to the gospel content as well as the "emotional response" to the season. As I look upon it, Advent is a time for recalling the anticipation of the coming of Jesus. That is a joyful anticipation. We make preparations for Christmas in our church, in our homes, and in our hearts. Have a joyful Advent.


